Peer Review Policy

***The International Journal of Restorative Justice (TIJRJ)* uses a double-blind peer reviewing system, which means that both the reviewer and author identities are concealed from the reviewers, and vice versa, throughout the review process.**

The full procedure is as follows: once an article is submitted to the journal through Editorial Manager (2 versions of the articles are asked, one with the author information and one anonymous) the Editorial Team has a first check as to suitability of form and content, and if it is deemed ok, they then decide who to send it out for review to. Two anonymous reviewers are then sent the anonymized version of the article. They have normally up to 4 weeks to send back their review. The editorial team looks at the reviews and if deemed appropriate, they are then sent to the authors with the result of the peer-review process (publishable as is, publishable with minor revisions, publishable with major revisions - also called 'revise and resubmit' - or rejected). If corrections/revisions are asked from the author, the author has 3 months to send back the revised version. The editorial team will then either look at the revised version themselves (especially in case of minor revisions) or will send the re-submitted article to one of the original peer-reviewers (especially in case of major revisions). Once the article is accepted it will be sent to production. We are currently working towards pre-publishing accepted articles online once accepted, but that is not yet available.
